

COOKIE POLICY

This website (www.fod.ie) (“our Site” or “the Site”) uses cookies to distinguish you from other users of our Site. This helps us to provide you with a good experience when you browse our Site and also allows us to improve our Site.

A cookie is a small file of letters and numbers that we store on your browser or the hard drive of your computer or internet-enabled device if you agree. Cookies contain information that is transferred to your computer's hard drive or internet-enabled device.

We use the following cookies:

- **Strictly necessary cookies.** These are cookies that are required for the operation of our Site. These necessary cookies enable core functionality, such as security, network management and accessibility.
- **Analytical or performance cookies.** These allow us to recognise and count the number of visitors and to see how visitors move around our Site when they are using it. This helps us to improve the way our Site works, for example, by ensuring that users are finding what they are looking for easily.
- **Functionality cookies.** These are used to recognise you when you return to our Site. This enables us to personalise our content for you, greet you by name and remember your preferences (for example, your choice of language or region).

You can find more information about the individual cookies we use and the purposes for which we use them in the table below:

Universal Analytics (Google)	_ga	This cookie is a Google Analytics persistent cookie which is used to distinguish unique users.	<i>Read Google's Overview of privacy and safeguarding data</i>
	_gid	This cookie is installed by Google Analytics. The cookie is used to store information of how visitors use a website and helps in creating an analytics report of how the website is doing. The data collected including the number visitors, the source where they have come from, and the pages visited in an anonymous form.	
	_gat	This cookie is used to throttle request rate. These are third party cookies that are placed on your device to allow us to use the Google Analytics service. These cookies are used to collect information about how visitors use our website. We use this information to compile reports and to help us improve the website.

These named third parties may include, for example, advertising networks and providers of external services like web traffic analysis services. These third party cookies are likely to be analytical cookies or performance cookies or targeting cookies:
